

Another Eureka Hospital Name Change Takes Effect

EUREKA - Bundled up to fight the cold and the snow, Jordan Nagle of Prairie Signs in Bloomington slides the revised Town and Country Healthcare sign in place beneath the new Advocate Eureka Hospital sign on South Major St. Gone is the familiar flame logo of BroMenn Healthcare System, which has been merged with the Advocate system. Long known as Eureka Hospital until 1984, the much cherished hospital became part of the Mennonite system in 1978 and was renamed Eureka Community Hospital as it became part of the new BroMenn System, which itself was a merger of Normal's Brokaw Hospital and Bloomington's Mennonite Hospital in 1984.
